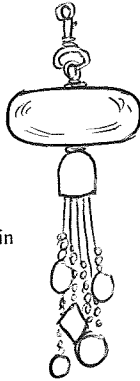

 Bag Tassle



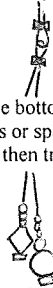
Ingredients

- 1m tigertail
- crimps
- OR
- headpins
- jumprings
- 0.5cm chain
- main feature bead
- 8-12 smaller feature beads
- seed beads (if desired)
- spacers/washers
- keyring clip or large parrot clasp
- end cone

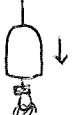
Recipe

Tigertail tassle

1. Cut 10cm of tigertail and using a crimp make a small loop on one end.
2. Cut 20cm of tigertail and thread this through the loop.
3. Fold tigertail in half and then crimp the ends together up close to the loop.
4. Thread a feature bead onto the bottom of the tigertail – frame with seed beads or spacers/washer. Crimp at the desired length and then trim excess tigertail.
5. Cut 15cm of tigertail and thread it through the loop and crimp in place. Thread a feature bead onto the bottom of the tigertail and crimp in place.
6. Continue making tigertail dangles until you have the desired amount (1m of tigertail will make approx 8 dangles).



7. Slide the end cone down over the first piece of tigertail to cover the small loop.



8. Thread on a feature bead and then crimp on the keyring clip or large parrot clasp.

Chain tassle

1. Take one headpin and cut off the flat head. Make a lollipop loop.
2. Cut the chain to a variety of lengths (2cm – 10cm in length). You will need 8 – 10 lengths of chain.
3. Using a jumpring attach one end of the chain to the lollipop loop on the end of the headpin. Repeat for remaining lengths of chain.



4. Thread a feature bead onto a headpin – frame with washers/spacers or seed beads.

5. Cut the headpin 1cm above the bead and make a lollipop loop using round nose pliers.



6. Using a jumpring attach the bead set to the end of one of the lengths of chain.

7. Continue until there is a bead set hanging off each length of chain.



8. Thread an end cone onto the headpin with the lollipop loop and the chain hanging off.

9. Thread on a feature bead and then make a lollipop loop. Using a jumpring attach the lollipop loop to a keyring clip or parrot clasp.

Wrapped loops can be used in place of lollipop loops if you are comfortable wrapping.
