**PROJECT OF THE MONTH!**  
*Sneaky Lariat*

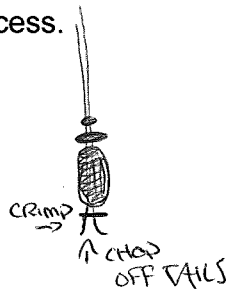
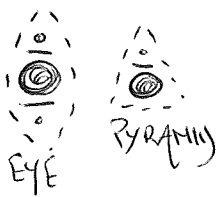
**Ingredients**

- 2 lengths of softflex or tigertail, 50cm each for a short lariat, 70cm each for a longer one (over your top)
- 2 crimp beads
- 2 main feature beads
- 6 – 12 smaller feature beads/accent beads
- Spacers as desired.

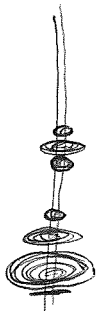
**PLEASE NOTE:** If you use tigertail for this necklace, you need to be careful how you store it to avoid kinks in the wire. Remember, once the wire is kinked, you can't unkink it. Where possible, use Softflex for this project, as it is more flexible, and doesn't kink like tigertail can.

**Recipe**

1. Hold the wires evenly together at the ends. Thread a feature bead set over both ends, in an eye or pyramid shape. Crimp the ends together under the last bead, trimming any excess.

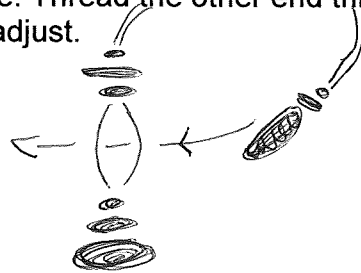


2. Work out a feature bead set for the other end. Then plan a smaller bead set that will sit above it. Thread these onto the other end, over both wires. Thread the smaller bead set first, then the larger. Crimp the ends together under the last bead, trimming any excess.



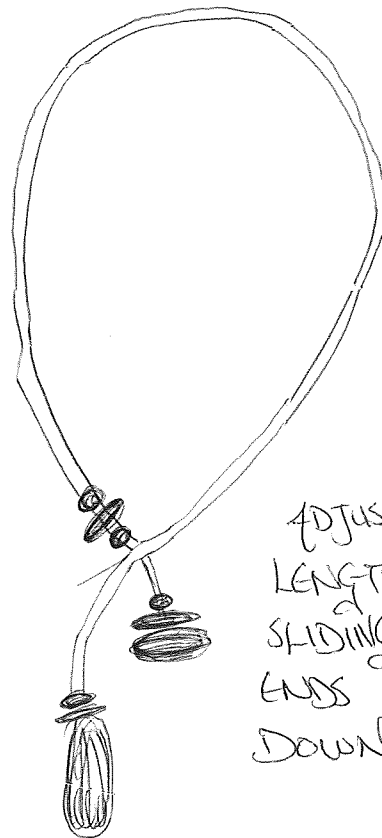
**TO WEAR THE NECKLACE**

- Open a gap between the wires in between the main feature bead set, and the smaller one above. Thread the other end through this gap, and adjust.



Too long for you?

- Simply slide one set of beads up the wires, cut off the crimp, and secure again at the correct level with another crimp bead. Trim the excess wire close to the crimp.



ADJUST THE LENGTH BY SLIDING THE ENDS UP + DOWN.
